

About Yachimun Street: Yachimun means “pottery” in the Okinawan language. In Japanese it is called Yakimono.

The street is 400m long and there are around 40 shops on the street.

History of Yachimun: Okinawa used to be the Ryukyu Kingdom about 300 years ago. The kingdom allowed the Okinawan pottery factories to move to Yachimun Street. From then until now, around 40 pottery shops have opened there.
